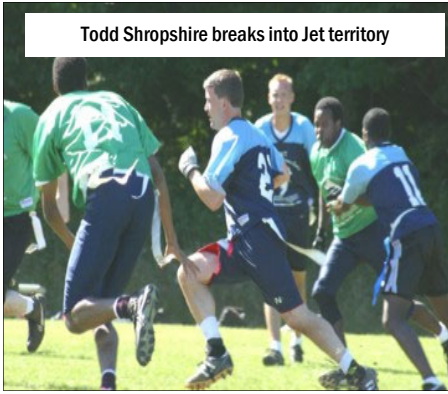
Add, Apply, and Aim

We enjoyed the privilege of having Kevin Pestke come and deliver the half-time message for us this week. Kevin potentially gave up his career and a year of his life to go to Africa a little over a year ago, as a missionary. Kevin challenged us with the verse from the book of Psalms.

Psalms 90:12 So teach us to number our days, that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom. Kevin

started by expressing our need to **add**. The average male lives to the age of 77. That calculate to roughly 28,000 days.
