The Saints came marching back mainly on two "prime time" catches by Shawn Brown. Brown more than made up for the interception he got stolen away. Rodric Cox Cooper then took a stuffed run up the middle, to the outside and scored from about three yards out to tie the game at 6. Rob Benedetto broke the game open and gave the Saints the victory when he fake pumped a pass and took off down the side line for a score. The Cowboys enjoyed sacks from Nate Wegman and Rob Mosjej.
